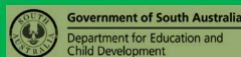





This week's Newsletter features some of the quality learning with Ms Howard's Room 15 class.

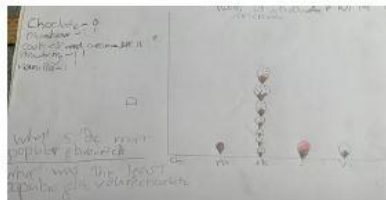
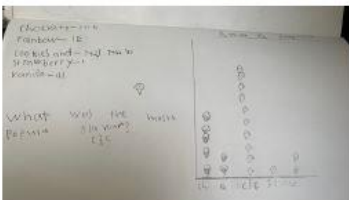
Room 15 Learning

Each year we ask for feedback from our parents with regard to various aspects of school performance over the year via an online survey.

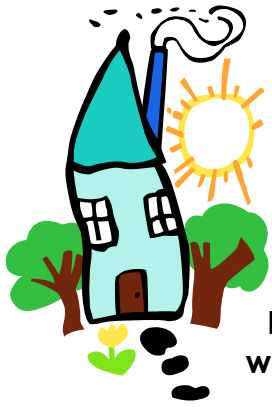
