A note from Jennie-Marie

Unprecedented, uncharted, uncertain, rapid changes...these are some terms we are hearing on a daily basis.

When you have children at home that you are supporting with their learning, you may be inclined to create a minute-by-minute schedule for them. You have high hopes of hours of learning, including online activities, science experiments, and book learning. You'll limit free-time technology until everything is done! But here's the thing...

Many of our children are just as scared as many of us are right now. They not only can hear everything that is going on around them, but they feel any adult tension and anxiety. They have never experienced anything like this before. Although the possibility of being off school for weeks sounds awesome, they are probably picturing a fun time like summer break, not the reality of being trapped at home and not seeing their friends and doing all the 'holiday' type things.

Over the coming weeks, you may see an increase in behavior issues; whether it is anxiety, or anger, or protest that they cannot do things normally. You may see more meltdowns, tantrums, and oppositional behavior too. This is normal and expected under these circumstances.

Be kind to yourself and others. Do the best you can do and we will do the same here at school. The teachers and SSOs are spending the last week of school working out how our learning is going to continue next term. While this has been a challenge, we are rising to it. There are many unanswered questions that everyone wants to know about the future and how the learning is going to look but please be assured that whenever I have new information we are getting it to you ASAP. The plan so far is that we need to be ready for children to be learning from home next term but how that looks is still being developed. How long that will be for is still unknown.

Please make sure you are signed up to TEAMAPP so you can get up to date information.

Finally, to the parents and caregivers who have given us positive comments, smiled at me when I need it and have been supporting us over the last few crazy weeks. Thank you! The Sheidow Park School community is a great community to be part of and we need to look after each other.

Dear parents/caregiver

However, COVID-19 is an unprecedented challenge and we understand that many of you would prefer to keep your children at home during this time. We support your choice. 


